## **PROJECT PERMITTING FAQ'S**



As you plan your construction project in Mascoutah, keep in mind you will be required to have specific permits approved, contractors licensed and fees paid, and conform to a number of code and entitlement approvals, depending on the specifics of your project. Consult with City Staff when beginning your process, and they will identify exactly which requirements you will need.

### Keep in mind the following:

- •Entitlement approvals usually have a time limit for construction; failure to begin or complete your project within the required time limit may void your permit, forcing you to re-submit your project for approval.
- •The City Codes are subject to change at any time; when in doubt, consult with Staff for the latest requirements.
- Failure to obtain the proper permits, approvals, or pay the appropriate fees will delay your project, typically far longer than the approval process itself.
- •Always be sure to consult with Staff to see if additional requirements are necessary.
