<u>Introduction</u>

In 2003, St. Clair County (County), Illinois and its communities created a Co-Permittee Group to join forces in complying with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Phase II requirements. As stated in the original 2003 Notice of Intent (NOI), the County and the Co-Permittee communities were to pool resources and work together to comply with the commitments made within the NOI for the benefit of all within the County.

The Co-Permittee Group was active during this reporting period. Significant progress was made sharing Best Management Practices (BMPs) for document retention, operation procedures, and maintenance activities.

Best Management Practice (BMP) Summary of 2010-2011 Activities

In 2003, each member of the Co-Permittee Group submitted a NOI in compliance with the first 5-year cycle. In 2008, a NOI was submitted in compliance with the next 5-year cycle, as written in the first MS4 permit. The 2009 NOI was submitted in compliance with additional requirements in the second MS4 permit. As stated in the 2003, 2008, and 2009 NOI, each Co-Permittee Member identified certain activities to comply with the Phase II requirements. Below is an abbreviated summary of the BMPs that were written in the NOI for each of the minimum control measures.

March 2010-February 2011:

- 1) **A.1-** A green infrastructure stormwater brochure was created comply with the 2009 permit. This brochure includes information on practices such as green roofs, rain barrels, and permeable pavement.
- 2) A.4- St. Clair County tracked the number of brochures handed out at the Fair.
- 3) **A.5-** Co-Permittee Group developed a program for distribution of brochures in the elementary school system. Communities received information on permit guidelines and examples of stormwater presentations
- 4) **B.3** Stormwater topics were discussed at the Environmental Committee. An update of the Committee was discussed at a Co-Permittee Meeting. The Co-Permittee met four (4) times to complete training and to develop and submit the Annual Report.
- 5) **B.6-** St. Clair County continued to promote programs related to stormwater activities. The community tracked its participation.
- 6) **C.1-** The Co-Permittee Group incorporated stream map reviews in training activities and promoted stream observations associated with road maintenance activities.
- 7) **C.2, 9-** St. Clair County developed a summary and outline of the ordinance and posted it on its website.

- 8) **C.5-** Community is completing the stenciling program. A standard for inlet stencils has been provided to the Co-Permittee Group.
- 9) **D.1, E.2, D.4, E.4-** St. Clair County developed a summary and outline of the ordinance. It was posted on the County's website.
- 10) **D.5-** St. Clair County continued to maintain a stormwater hotline number to address public concerns related to stormwater issues. County tracked and reported the number of calls.
- 11) **D.6, E.5-** No-specific milestone for this reporting year.
- 12) **F.1-** The Co-Permittee group conducted a site visit of the Village of Shiloh Street Department to discuss potential sources of pollution from municipal operations and best management practices to minimize pollution. The training course also covered MS4 documentary requirements and green infrastructure topics, including the recently implemented grant program.
- 13) **F.6-** Operation procedures for street department activities were reviewed and modified when needed. Co-Permittee meetings included reference to review and update requirements.

The following pages highlight changes made to the BMPs from the NOI, BMP status, and activities planned for the next reporting year. Additional information is also provided from the County and each Community.

BMP A.5 Classroom Educational Materials

The County has taken steps to educate schoolchildren on the severity of stormwater pollution. The St. Clair County Health Department issues a newsletter each month and it is posted on the Regional Office of Education's website. The newsletter consists of articles for students with a wide range of pollution topics, including stormwater. The newsletter also lists upcoming recycling events and schools that have won past recycling contests. The St. Clair, Madison, and Monroe County Soil and Water Conservation Districts sponsored an "Envirothon," composed of teams from area high schools. This is an environmental field competition that tests students in six areas of natural resource management. Four schools from Madison and one from St. Clair County took part in the competition.

BMP B.6 Community Events - Recycling Programs

Throughout the year, St. Clair County sponsored community events that potentially could positively impact stormwater quality. These activities include Christmas tree collection, household hazardous waste collection, telephone book, and paper recycling. Nineteen Christmas tree drop off sites were available throughout the County. Paper recycling was held in 97 schools and in 2010, and a total of 5,929,514 pounds was collected. The Telephone Book Recycling Program gave the community the opportunity to drop off telephone books at 18 locations around the County. In the spring of 2010, 47 tons of telephone books were collected. This is significant because paper recycling through schools reinforces the value of properly managing waste material.

The County issued 22 press releases related to initiatives that minimize stormwater pollution. Fifty-two workshops and presentations were supported by the County in an effort to reduce all types of pollution, including stormwater. In 2010, 1,807 consultations and outreach activities were prepared to support Best Management Practices related to waste disposal and other health related activities. During these activities, 6,500 stormwater pollution related materials were distributed. St. Clair County exceeded the State of Illinois mandated recycling program quota of 25% waste recycled with a current 28.4% rate. In July 2010, the County revised the St. Clair County Recycling Directory to give residents an updated listing of all businesses and government offices involved in the recycling programs and what type of material is collected. These sponsored events encourage public participation to prevent pollutants in the storm sewer system.

BMP C.5 Illicit Source Removal Procedures

The St. Clair County Highway Department sponsors an Adopt-a-Highway Program throughout the County. Seventy-three miles of roads in the County were adopted and cleaned at least four times a year. By sponsoring this program, St. Clair County is eliminating a significant source of stormwater pollution by keeping trash out of streams and keeping road ditches clear of debris for storm events.

BMP D.6 & E.5 Construction Site Training

On October 15, 2010, the Erosion and Sediment Control Workshop was held at the Tempe Building on the campus of Lewis and Clark Community College. The event was sponsored by the St. Clair, Madison, Jersey, and Monroe County Soil and Water Conservation Districts. Presentations were given on seeding techniques, new stormwater regulations, measuring turbidity, and an update on the Illinois Urban Manual. An afternoon session consisted of a tour of the new Confluence Field Station in Alton, IL. 135 people attended the event, many of which included representatives from St. Clair Co-Permittee Communities.

Four trees were planted by the City on October 2009.

Eighty-five students from Mascoutah High School attended the "Rediscover the River" workshop in August 2010. Held at the Melvin Price Locks and Dam and NGRREC Confluence Field Station, students learned about water quality studies through hand-on sessions and asking questions of the officials present. Input from the workshop was shared with President Obama via a briefing.

Recycling programs were contracted out by the City to Waste Management. Recyclables were picked up from households weekly.

1.5 miles of ditches along roadways were graded by the City.

Ninety hours of street sweeping was performed by the City removing 10,300 pounds of material.

Twenty catch basins were cleaned within the permit year.
