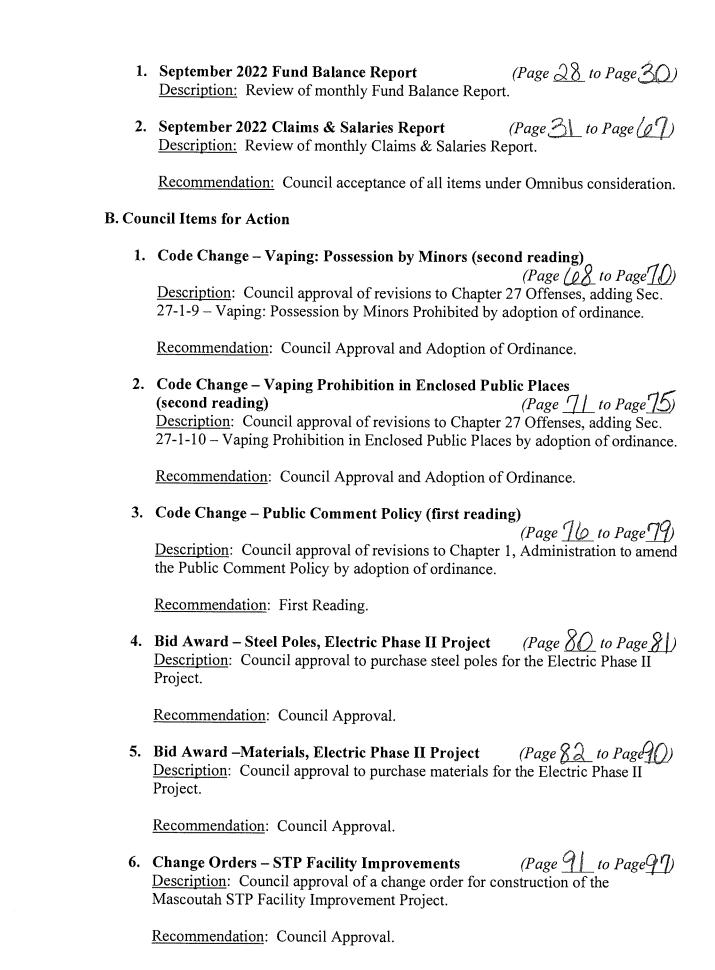

CODE CHANGE - VAPING PROHIBITION IN ENCLOSED PUBLIC PLACES (FIRST READING)

Assistant City Manager presented report to Council for approval of revisions to Chapter 27 Offenses, adding Sec. 27-1-10 - Vaping Prohibition in Enclosed Public Places by adoption of Ordinance.

City Attorney stated that he agreed with how the ordinance is written but spoke on the need for signage. City Attorney stated that establishment owners can also be fined; he believes that there could be an enforcement issue at local establishments.

Police Chief stated that the Clear Air Indoor Act requires the signage. This ordinance would simply require an updated sign to include no vaping.

Councilman Seibert stated that many of the business owners he has spoken with agree with this new code change.

Councilman Weyant stated that the city should purchase the signage for businesses to pick up. He asked for the city to look into signage and pricing.

Mascoutah City Council Meeting Monday October 17, 2022 Fire Department Report

- 1. Mascoutah FD answered 16 calls for assistance in September.
- 2. 3511 is back in service after being gone for a week for Sentinel's open house and pour tours.
- 3. At the annual meeting on October 11th, the Mascoutah Volunteer Fire Company chose to recommend to reappoint the current chief officers. Also, the current slate of MVFC officers were re-elected.
- 4. MFD is working on setting up IFSI and SWIC classes for 2023. We have 2 members that will begin the basic firefighter program at SWIC in January.
- 5. In an effort to comply with I-OSHA regulations, MFD is looking into updating its respiratory safety program and possibly providing annual physicals for its members.
- 6. The chief officers of the department have been evaluating the long and short terms goals of the MFD and trying to determine the best course of action to reach those goals. At this time, the largest issue that we deal with is being able to cover the administrative side of the department.
- 7. The MVFC will be holding our Mulligan in Chili on October 30, this will be a pre-order carry out only event as it was the last two years.

CITY OF MASCOUAH FINANCIAL SNAP SHOT SEPTEMBER 2022, 42% OF FISCAL YEAR ELAPSED

Operating Revenues/Expenses

The Snap Shot overview shows the City operating revenues at 52.26% for September 2022 with 5 months posted. This is on target with our operating budget.

The Snap Shot overview shows the City operating expenses at 41.16% for September 2022 with 5 months posted. This is slightly below the operating budget for the fiscal year.

Non-Operating Revenues/Expenses

The non-operating revenues and expenses are lower than the budget for September 2022 with 5 months posted primarily due to anticipated loan proceeds this fiscal year. This is expected until the electric phase II loan payments are drawn down on the loan and the wwtp loan reimbursements are received from IEPA.

SUBJECT: City Engineer Project Status Report

MEETING DATE: October 17, 2022

Items that have changed since the last report are shown below in bold underlined text.

Major Electric - Phase 2

- This project will consist of constructing two 138kV Transmission Lines to connect a new North Substation and the existing Union Substation to Ameren's proposed ring bus to improve reliability and add capacity to our current distribution system. The transmission line for the new North Substation will be located on the east side of Route 4, west of and adjacent to Ameren's existing transmission line. The new transmission line for the Union Substation will be located between our existing Breaker Station (tap point) and the proposed ring bus, north of and adjacent to Ameren's existing transmission line.
- This project also includes isolating existing distribution lines to provide an Express Circuit, to directly connect the Union Substation to the new North Substation. Construction of the Express Circuit was completed in March 2017.
- A public information meeting was held on April 1, 2013, to present the project scope and the preliminary designed power line alignment to property owners and interested parties.
- Staff was notified by IMEA on November 6, 2015, that Ameren has proposed to construct their ring bus near Rte. 4 providing the City two connection points, one for the existing Union Street Substation and one for the proposed new North Substation. Construction of the Ameren ring bus is complete.
- While Ameren has previously denied City requests to locate the City's new 138kV lines on Ameren poles, Ameren reopened discussions on the possibility of Mascoutah and Ameren constructing a shared pole line on Ameren's current easement. This option is preferred by many of the landowners in lieu of granting additional easements, however this option has been determined to be cost prohibitive.
- The project team is currently focusing on easement acquisition for Transmission Line 2, engineering and plan preparation for the North Sub Upgrades, and procurement equipment and materials. Construction of Transmission Line 1 from the Ameren ring bus to the existing breaker station is complete.
- Project expenditures to date amount to just over \$2.7M which includes engineering and easement acquisition to date, materials for a portion of the 138 kV Transmission Line, Express Circuit construction, and the City's portion of the Ameren Ring Bus construction. The cost to complete

- this project is estimated at approximately \$9.5M for a total final project cost of approximately \$12.2M. These costs could be inflated an additional 25% if the current supply chain issues continue.
- This project is being paid for with reserve Electric Funds and a \$7M Bank Loan or Line of Credit to be paid back with Electric Funds.

Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and Collection System Improvements

- Horner & Shifrin (H&S) engineering contract for this project was approved at the June 18, 2018 City Council Meeting in the amount of \$1,898,000.
- This project includes evaluation, design, preparation of plans and specifications, preparation of applicable permits, and construction engineering services for a new SBR Sewage Treatment Plant and collection system improvements. The recommended improvements were developed over several years through the completion of the Wastewater Facilities Plan by H&S which included analyzing our existing sanitary sewer collection system and sewage treatment plant and making recommendations for upgrading and increasing capacity of the plant to meet new IEPA regulations and to accommodate future growth.
- Staff met with H&S on July 10, 2018 for project kickoff and participated in eight workshops at H&S's office in O'Fallon, IL where venders presented their equipment lines. H&S and City Staff have completed the evaluation of the equipment and selection of the most appropriate equipment to meet the City's needs. H&S submitted the final Basis of Design Memorandums April 22, 2019 for city review. Engineering progress was slowed while the purchase of the land for the WWTP was completed. Staff met with H&S December 12, 2019 to discuss project status and update the project schedule.
- H&S submitted preliminary (30% complete) WWTP Plans for review February 21, 2020 and a plan review meeting with H&S was held on March 20, 2020. H&S submitted preliminary (60% complete) plans April 17, 2020. H&S submitted pre-final (90% complete) plans June 9, 2020. Construction documents were released for bid February 15, 2021. Bids were opened April 8, 2021. The low bid in the amount of \$13,808,000.00 was submitted by Plocher Construction.
- Construction cost including construction engineering services is estimated at approximately \$14.2M and will be paid for with Sewer Funds and a low interest IEPA Loan.
- The City's application for an Illinois Water Pollution Control Loan has been approved by IEPA.
- Notice to proceed with construction was issued to Plocher Construction Company August 3, 2021. The material and equipment submittal process is ongoing and on-site construction started September 20, 2021. Construction of the SBR, headworks building, filter building, and Administration Building is in progress as well as earth excavation, storm sewer, site piping, and riprap placement around the lagoons. Construction is scheduled to be substantially complete on or before January 31, 2023.

North Lebanon Street Improvements Project

• This project consists of the reconstruction of North Lebanon Street from Church Street to Harnett Street, Green Street from Market Street to Jefferson Street, Patterson Street from Lebanon Street to Jefferson Street, and Oak Street from Market Street to Lebanon Street. Improvements will include constructing new concrete gutter, concrete sidewalk, and concrete driveway aprons,

removing existing oil & chip pavement, and constructing hot-mix asphalt pavement on new aggregate base. The total length of this project is approximately 3,050 feet and the estimated construction cost is \$2,300,000.

- This project will be paid for with TIF2B project funds.
- Bids were opened April 12, 2022. Approval of low bid submitted by Hank's Excavating and Landscaping, Inc. in the amount of \$2,203,007.80 was approved at the April 18, 2022 City Council meeting. Notice to proceed with construction was issued to Hank's Excavating & Landscaping Inc. May 2, 2022.
- Utility locating has been completed and plans are being evaluated to eliminate utility conflicts. Utility relocation is underway. <u>Tree removal started October 12, 2022. Storm sewer</u> construction is tentatively scheduled to begin November 1, 2022.

South, Independence and John Street Improvements

- Oates Associates engineering contract for this project was approved at the April 6, 2020 City Council Meeting for a lump sum price of \$99,625.00.
- This project consists of the reconstruction of South Street from Jefferson Street to John Street, Independence Street from South Street to State Street, and John Street from South Street to Main Street. Improvements are anticipated to include constructing new concrete gutter, concrete sidewalk, and concrete driveway aprons, removing existing oil & chip pavement, and constructing hot-mix asphalt pavement on new aggregate base. The total length of this project is approximately 1,450 feet and the estimated construction cost is \$800,000.
- The majority of this project will be paid for with TIF2B project funds. General project funds will be used for the remainder.
- Final plan preparation is in nearing completion. Staff has made substantial progress with the easement acquisition process. This project is expected to be advertised for bids as soon as IDOT Access Permits are approved for the intersections with E Main Street (IL 177) and S Jefferson Street (IL 4).

IDOT IL Route 177 (Main Street) Pavement Replacement and ADA Improvements

- IDOT District 8 is planning to improve Main Street (IL 177) through the city limits.
- According to an August 27, 2021 letter from IDOT, the project will include pavement replacement and ADA improvements. The project is currently included in IDOT's FY2022-2027 Proposed Highway Improvement Program. IDOT District 8 and their engineering consultants are continuing with Phase 1 work, which consists of developing the project scope, environmental studies and preliminary design.
- Sidewalks and other features that the City may desire to be included with the project may require cost and maintenance participation by the City. Tentatively, the City would be required to pay for parking lanes, curbs adjacent to parking lanes, and sidewalk. General funds and TIF 2B funds would be used for the City's portion of the project.
- IDOT and their engineering consultants, as of September 13, 2022, are currently evaluating existing conditions, working on drainage studies, and working on intersection design studies. They are considering bike and pedestrian accommodations and the Mascoutah Great Streets

Initiative study. They are also looking at the condition of storm sewer and other facilities beneath the pavement for potential repair or replacement. When studies are more complete, IDOT plans to meet with the City and other stakeholders to discuss the project and determine what improvements are needed and desired. Following the stakeholder meetings, IDOT plans to hold a public meeting to seek more input. Preparation of final construction plans will commence upon completion of the study phase.

N Jefferson Street (IL 4) Shared Use Path

- The City was awarded a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant in the amount of \$324,012 for the N Jefferson Street (IL 4) Shared Use Path. The grant will cover approximately 80% of the total project cost. The scope of this project is to provide a 10-foot-wide shared use asphalt path approximately 1,500 feet in length along the west side of Jefferson Street (IL RT 4). The project will begin at the existing Berm Trail and continue east to Jefferson Street (IL RT 4) then north along the west side of Jefferson Street (IL RT 4) to Heritage Way. A pedestrian bridge will be constructed over the Mascoutah Surface Water Protection District Diversional Channel (Big Ditch).
- The Quality Based Selection (QBS) process is complete. TWM, Inc. was selected for design, preparation of plans and specifications, and bidding assistance. An Engineering Services Agreement with TWM was approved at the April 18, 2022 City Council Meeting and has been submitted to IDOT for approval.

L&N Railway Trail and Trailhead

- The City was awarded an Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) Grant in the amount of \$918,000 for the L&N Railway Trail and Trailhead Project. The City was also awarded a Metro East Park and Recreation District (MEPRD) grant in the amount of \$64,415.00 for this project. The combined grants will fund approximately 96% of project cost. The scope of the project is to provide a 10-foot-wide shared use asphalt path approximately 5,450 feet in length along the old L&N Railway corridor from S Jefferson Street (IL 4) to S 10th Street along with a trail head and parking lot near S Jefferson Street.
- An initial kick-off meeting was held with IDOT July 8, 2021. The Quality Based Selection (QBS) process is complete. Oates Associates was selected for design, preparation of plans and specifications, and bidding assistance. An Engineering Services Agreement with Oates Associates was approved at the May 16, 2022 City Council Meeting and has been submitted to IDOT for approval.

Electric 13.8 kV Distribution System Upgrade Design Build Project

• This project consists of constructing a new distribution line and improving the current distribution system to increase the capacity and improve the reliability of the City's electric distribution system to serve new development along Route 4, at I-64, and for the new Boeing development. This project includes approximately three miles of overhead conductor upgrades and extensions, a 1.25-mile duct bank from the north substation to the Boeing development, and a 1.75-mile underground circuit from the north substation to the north of I-64.



- A design build contract with BHMG and Big D Electrical Contractors in the amount of \$10,937,464.00 was approved at the November 1, 2021 City Council Meeting. This project will be paid for with TIF3 project funds and Electric funds. City Staff is currently negotiating with the developers of the Boeing Production Facility for reimbursement of approximately one third of the estimated project cost.
- <u>Design-Build construction is approximately 70% complete</u>. Substantial completion of construction is scheduled no later than July 31, 2023.

Onyx Drive Improvements

- Onyx Drive pavement is failing likely due to poor drainage conditions and storm water that periodically overtops the road. Long term plans call for Onyx Drive to be widened to become a collector road if the land to the north is developed. Since the exiting Onyx Drive pavement is failing, we are starting engineering work to consider raising the road profile and improving drainage. The road will not be widened at this time but will be rebuilt in a way that would still allow future widening. Curb and gutter will be added on the south side of the street and a ditch section will remain of the north side.
- An engineering services agreement with TWM in the amount of \$74,900.00 was approved at the August 15, 2022 City Council Meeting and approved by IDOT August 26, 2022.
- MFT funds will be utilized for this project.
- Engineering and right-of-way acquisition is underway.

S County Road / McKinley Reconstruction

- This project consists of the reconstruction of S County Road from Main Street to Eisenhower Street and the reconstruction of McKinley Street from S County Road to the recently constructed Lakeside Estates Subdivision. Improvements will include the construction of storm sewer, concrete curb and gutter, concrete sidewalk, concrete driveway aprons, and hot-mix asphalt pavement on new aggregate base. The total length of this improvement is approximately 1,500 feet.
- An engineering services agreement with Oates Associates in the amount of \$123,040.00 was approved at the August 15, 2022 City Council Meeting and approved by IDOT August 26, 2022.
- Rebuild Illinois Bond Grant (RBI) funds and MFT funds will be utilized for this project.
- Engineering work is underway.

Other Miscellaneous Projects

• City staff is working with the Mascoutah Surface Water Protection District on the repair of the underground drainage tunnel under Church Street and Market Street. Notice to proceed with construction was issued to KRB Excavating, Inc. in the amount of \$227,000.00. The culvert repair was extended 37 feet to the southwest due to the discovery of additional defects of the top slab during demolition. The total cost of the construction has increased to \$282,125.00. TIF2B funds will be used to pay the City's share (50%) of the cost, \$141,062.50. Construction is substantially complete. A punch list has been issued to KRB Excavating for completion.

• FY23 MFT curb and sidewalk replacement is underway with Hank's Excavating and Landscaping. Construction of a new sidewalk at the intersection of Park Drive with N 6th Street is complete. The new sidewalk provides a route for students walking from the middle school across N 6th Street to continue west along Park Drive. Existing sidewalk that was in poor condition was also replaced and the area was graded so that storm water will drain across the new sidewalk to a new swale along Park Drive and out to the N 6th Street storm sewer.
Construction of a new curb ramp and sidewalk at the corner of State and Market Streets is also complete.

BACKGROUND & STAFF COMMENTS:

Per commitment, the City Manager is forwarding the Finance Department's Monthly Claims & Salaries Council Report. This includes a check register from accounts payable and a transmittal report from payroll.

Check Register - Monthly Expense Report for Council

This report gives detailed information regarding the checks written to pay vendors in accounts payable for the month, including the date, check number, vendor name/number, invoice number, invoice amount, description, general ledger account number, and check amount.

The Accounts Payable total recorded in the month of September is \$3,147,290.59. Some payments are noted for recording and accounting purposes while others are noted below for various purchases, loan obligations and projects.

The following payments for this month are exceptions or one-time payments not related to daily or monthly operations:

- The Answerman Inc not a true vendor expense, revenues are collected and posted through cash receipting; then as per agreement a portion of this is paid back to the inspector through accounts payable for 1099 accounting purposes
- <u>Mascoutah Library</u> not a true vendor expense, the City receives all property taxes via ach to one bank account and for accounting purposes a check is processed for the library's portion
- <u>BRG Inspections and/or Michael S Ehret</u> not a true vendor expense, revenues are collected and posted through cash receipting; then a specified amount is paid to the plumbing inspector
- <u>Misc Refund(s)</u> not a true vendor expense, revenues collected are refunded through accounts payable for accounting and auditing purposes
- <u>WWTP</u> it is also important to note that expenses related to the Waste Water Treatment Plant are not actual expenses since we get the money back from our IEPA loan quarterly

- Tesco the Eastern Specialty Co AMI metering project, \$122,068.55

Transmittal Report - Salary Report for Council

This report gives summarized information regarding the salaries paid to employees. It is summarized by department and number of employees paid. The total net amount paid to employees in September equals \$390,538.58. The average payroll every month ranges from \$230,000 to \$255,000 unless there are three pay periods in the month or there is seasonal expense. September DID have three pay dates and very little seasonal expenses for grounds, park and pool.

CHAPTER 27 – OFFENSES ARTICLE I – CRIMINAL CODE ADOPTED

Sec. 27-1-9 – Vaping: Possession by Minors Prohibited

- (a) *Purpose.* This section shall be cited as "Vaping: Possession by Minors Prohibited," the purpose of which is to protect the public health, comfort, and environment by prohibiting vaping alternative nicotine products to be possessed by minors, under the age of 21.
- (b) *Definitions*. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - (1) Alternative nicotine products mean a product or device not consisting of or containing leaf tobacco that provides for the ingestion into the body of nicotine by any means, but excluding any product approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration as a tobacco cessation product, tobacco dependency product, or for other medical purpose, and being marketed solely for that approved purpose.
 - (2) *Vape* or *Vaping* means using a vapor cigarette or alternative vapor transmission modality to vape alternative nicotine products.
 - (3) Vapor cigarettes or alternative vapor transmission modalities mean devices which contain a cartridge or open space filled with nicotine and/or other chemicals which are turned into vapor or steam that is inhaled and exhaled by the user including but not limited to e-cigarettes, e-cigs, vape, wax vape pens or other similar modalities.

(c) Penalty.

- (1) If a minor is in violation of the provisions of this Section shall be guilty of an offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$200.00 and/or subject to twenty (20) hours of community service.
- (2) A minor in violation of the provisions of this Section for a subsequent offense shall be guilty of an offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$300.00 and/or subject to forty (40) hours of community service. If offenses occur more than one year from a prior offense date, the cycle of minimum fines set for this section shall renew.

CHAPTER 27 – OFFENSES ARTICLE I – CRIMINAL CODE ADOPTED

Sec. 27-1-10 - Vaping Prohibition in Enclosed Public Places.

- (a) *Purpose*. This section shall be cited as "The Mascoutah Indoor Vape-Free Ordinance," the purpose of which is to protect the public health, comfort, and environment by prohibiting vaping alternative nicotine products: in all enclosed public places and places of employment; within 15 feet of all public entrances to such places; and within enclosed public places in order to ensure that non-smokers and non-vapers may breathe air free from the hazardous effects of second-hand smoke and alternative nicotine products.
- (b) *Definitions*. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - (1) Alternative nicotine products means a product or device not consisting of or containing leaf tobacco that provides for the ingestion into the body of nicotine by any means, but excluding any product approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration as a tobacco cessation product, tobacco dependency product, or for other medical purpose, and being marketed solely for that approved purpose.
 - (2) *Vape* or *Vaping* means using a vapor cigarette or alternative vapor transmission modality to vape alternative nicotine products.
 - (3) Vapor cigarettes or alternative vapor transmission modalities mean devices which contain a cartridge or open space filled with nicotine and/or other chemicals which are turned into vapor or steam that is inhaled and exhaled by the user including but not limited to e-cigarettes, e-cigs, vape, wax vape pens or other similar modalities.
 - (4) Public Places means that portion of any building or vehicle used by and open to the public, regardless of whether the building or vehicle is owned in whole or in part by private persons or entities, the City of Mascoutah, or any other public entity and regardless of whether a fee is charged for admission, including a minimum distance of 15 feet from entrances, exits, windows that open, and ventilation intakes that serve an enclosed area where smoking is prohibited. A "public place" does not include a private residence unless the private residence is used to provide licensed child care, foster care, or other similar social service care on the premises. A "public place" includes, but is not limited to, hospitals, restaurants, retail stores, offices, commercial establishments, elevators, indoor theaters, libraries, museums, concert halls, public conveyances, educational facilities, nursing homes,

auditoriums, enclosed or partially enclosed sports arenas, meeting rooms, schools, exhibition halls, convention facilities, polling places, private clubs, gaming facilities, all government owned vehicles and facilities, including buildings and vehicles owned, leased, or operated by the City of Mascoutah or City subcontract, healthcare facilities or clinics, enclosed shopping centers, retail service establishments, financial institutions, ticket areas, public hearing facilities, public restrooms, waiting areas, lobbies, bars, taverns, bowling alleys, skating rinks, reception areas, and no less than 75% of the sleeping quarters within a hotel, motel, resort, inn, lodge, bed and breakfast, or other similar public accommodation that are rented to guests, but excludes private residences.

(c) Signs. Each owner, lessor, lessee, employer, or other person in control of a public place, shall post conspicuous "no smoking or vaping" signs at all entrances to such places where smoking or vaping is prohibited. Such "no smoking or vaping" signs shall have a white field with the words "no smoking or vaping" printed in red letters, four inches high with a one-half inch face, or shall bear the international "no smoking or vaping" symbols. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove, deface or obscure any sign posted pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

(d) Penalty.

- (1) Any person who vapes in an area where smoking or vaping is prohibited under the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of an offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$200.00 and not more than \$750.00.
- (2) Any person who owns, manages, operates or otherwise controls an enclosed public place, a place of employment, that permits vaping in an area where or vaping is prohibited under the provisions of this chapter, shall be guilty of an offense punishable by a fine of not less than (i) \$200.00 for the first violation, (ii) not less than \$500.00 for a second violation within one year after the first violation, and (iii) not less than \$750.00 for an offense within one year after the second violation. If offenses occur more than one year from a prior offense date, the cycle of minimum fines set forth in this subsection shall renew. Upon a third violation within a two-year period by a person/entity holding a city license/permit, the mayor, after a hearing in which the violator may contest the violation or penalty, may suspend or revoke any city license/permit for the premises in which the violation occurred.
- (3) Each day any violation of this chapter shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

Chapter 1 - ADMINISTRATION ARTICLE IX. PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

Sec. 1-9-1. Public comment permitted.

Public comment shall be listed on each regularly scheduled City Council or commission meeting and persons shall be allowed to address the City Council or commission members as set forth in the following provisions.

Sec. 1-9-2. City council meeting provisions.

- (a) The city shall provide two <u>one</u> public comment periods in a city council meeting, one at the beginning of the meeting and one at the end of the meeting as listed on the agenda.
- (b) Individuals wishing to address the city council during the first public comment period are requested to complete the sign-up sheet prior to the start of the meeting. The sign-up sheet will be located at the entrance to the council chambers. Speakers may address the city council in the order listed. Each person may speak for a maximum of three minutes.
- (c) During the second public comment period, the mayor will then ask if anyone else wishes to address the city council. For this comment period, those who desire to speak who had not previously requested to do so will be recognized in the order of their request. Those who spoke in the first comment period are also eligible to speak in the second comment period. Each person may speak for a maximum of three minutes.
- (d) Each speaker shall address the city council from the podium. Each speaker shall speak clearly and provide their name and address. Names of individuals will be recorded in the minutes of the meetings.
- (e) Speakers shall direct their comments to the city council and not to the audience. Council members shall direct their comments to their colleagues or staff members and not to the audience or the speaker. The mayor, city manager or his representative and/or city attorney shall address the speaker if needed.

Sec. 1-9-3. Commission meeting provisions.

- (a) One public comment period shall be provided during commission meetings.
- (b) At the appropriate time in the meeting, the commission chairman shall ask if anyone wishes to address the commission and will determine the order in which speakers will be recognized. Each person may speak for a maximum of three minutes.
- (c) Speakers shall direct their comments to the commission members and not to the audience. Commission members shall direct their comments to their colleagues or staff members and not to the audience or the speaker. The commission chairman or city manager or his representative and/or city attorney shall address the speaker if needed.

Sec. 1-9-4. Public hearing provisions.

Public hearings are held before the city council and/or various commission meetings of the city and provide the public the opportunity to comment on a specific issue(s) for the particular hearing. The public comment period shall follow a presentation of the subject of the hearing by a staff member or their representative.

- (a) Those wishing to speak or ask questions during the public hearing period are requested to complete the sign-up sheet prior to the start of the public hearing. The sign-up sheet will be located at the entrance to the council chambers. Speakers may address the city council or commission members in the order listed.
- (b) Each person may speak for a maximum of three minutes. Speakers shall direct their comments to the city council or commission members and not to the audience. Speakers shall limit their comments to the subject of the hearing.
- (c) City council or commission members shall direct their comments to their colleagues or staff members and not to the audience or the speaker. The mayor, commission chairman, city manager or his representative and/or city attorney shall address the speaker if needed.
- (d) These provisions shall not apply to public hearings conducted by the zoning board of appeals.

Sec. 1-9-5. Conduct.

- (a) If numerous persons wish to speak on a single topic, said persons shall be recognized, but repeated comments shall be discouraged.
- (b) Speakers, the public audience, and the city council or commission members shall maintain proper decorum at all times and shall not use abusive or foul language, make personal attack comments or exhibit unruly behavior. Any person who poses a threat or violates these decorum guidelines is subject to removal from the meeting.

SUBJECT: Change Orders – STP Facility Improvements

DATE: October 17, 2022

REQUESTED ACTION:

Council approval of a change order for construction of the Mascoutah STP Facility Improvement Project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

A contract with Plocher Construction Company, Inc in the amount of \$13,808,000 for construction of the Mascoutah STP Facility Improvement Project was approved at the April 19, 2021 City Council Meeting. Construction has been progressing well but several items have been discovered that require deviations from the approved plans and specifications that are part of the construction contract. Change orders in the amount of \$119,259.22 were approved at the August 15, 2022 City Council Meeting increasing the total contract amount from \$13,808,000 to \$13,927,259.22.

This request is for approval of an additional change order and authorization for the expenditure in the amount not to exceed \$106,878.00. See Memorandum of Contract Changes, Attachment A. If approved, the total contract amount will be increased from \$13,927,259.22 to a maximum amount of \$14,034,137.22. An increase of 1.6% over the original contract price.

As explained in the attached memorandum, this is a not to exceed cost. The final cost will be based on the actual time and materials required for installation. Our consulting engineer, Horner & Shifrin (H&S) will be on-site for the duration of the installation to verify the contractor's time and equipment needed. Additionally, H&S has agreed to pay for the increases in cost for material and labor that have occurred since project was bid in April 2021, which amounts to a maximum of \$12,432.92. The H&S cost share will be adjusted based on the actual installation cost.

Staff has reviewed and discussed this change order with Horner & Shifrin, and Plocher Construction Company. All items included in this change order have been deemed necessary for the proper operation of the facility. Staff recommends approval of a change order in the amount not to exceed of \$106,878.00.

FUNDING: The cost of this project will be paid with Sewer Funds and a low interest IEPA Loan.

RECOMMENDATION:

Council approval of a change order in the amount not to exceed \$106,878.00 for the construction of the Mascoutah STP Facility Improvement project.

SUGGESTED MOTION:

I move that the Council approve a change order in the amount not to exceed \$106,878.00 for the construction of the Mascoutah STP Facility Improvement project and authorize appropriate City officials to execute the necessary documents.

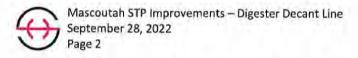

The purpose of this memorandum is to document necessary changes to the Mascoutah STP Improvements project to add the digester decant Sewer line.

The bid documents showed the discharge from the digester decanter penetrating the steel wall of the tank, but the buried portion of the line was not included. No questions were received from the contractors during the bidding process. This sewer includes approximately 100 linear feet of 8-inch diameter ductile iron pipe that extends from the digester tank to an existing manhole at the southeast corner of the digester where the existing discharge is located. The depth of the pipe ranges from 5 to 8 feet deep.

A cost of \$100,305 for the materials and labor to install the digester decant line and restore the sidewalk was provided, with the prime contractor completing the restoration. The pipe installation will be completed by a mechanical subconsultant for \$79,800 and the contractor's markup price was \$84,447. Backup for the costs was requested and a summary was provided by the contractor. Due to increasing pipe costs and supply issues, the City authorized the contractor to purchase the materials in an effort to prevent schedule impacts for the project. The price provided by the contractor was being questioned and Horner & Shifrin recommended that the pipe installation be installed using a time and materials basis to control costs. A detailed breakdown was provided by the contractor on July 8, 2022, resulting in a higher cost for the pipe installation from the mechanical sub of \$87,243.26 to which the prime contractor's markup would need to be added for an estimated total cost of over \$91,000. The revised total cost for the Administration Building change Request is \$113,500 but includes costs for previous changes that have been approved by the Council. The total cost for the digester decant line is



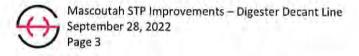
\$106,878. The material cost from the original estimate of \$9,800, provided by the prime contractor, which increased to \$11,253.01 with the actual purchase of the pipe in May 2022. The cost breakdown includes vacuum trunk rental for excavation, but to date the contractor has not needed to utilize a vacuum truck for excavation. The contractor has already installed a 12-inch diameter pipe that will drain the SBR tanks, located behind the existing filter building, adjacent to the lagoon. The 12-inch pipe was over 11 feet deep and no vacuum truck was required for this installation. The area is wet and does not drain well, but the digester work will be completed near the end of October, which should be a dryer time of year. The subcontractor is also estimating that construction will take two (2) weeks to install the pipe. Horner & Shifrin used a minimum production data for the project to date of 20 feet per day, resulting in four (4) days for construction. There is an electrical line that serves the digester pumps; however, a new line is being installed with the improvements and will not impact the installation of the pipe. Horner and Shifrin requested that the contractor obtain two additional bids for the pipe installation. One vendor was not interested in bidding the project and a second, from BM Contracting, resulting in a proposal of \$74,650.

Horner & Shifrin generated an engineer's cost estimate for the pipe installation excluding restoration to allow for comparison to the mechanical subconsultants cost. The engineering estimate utilized the actual pipe material cost, resulting in a total installed cost of approximately \$44,000 to be compared to the subcontractor's estimate.

Paying the contractor on a time and materials basis may result in a lower cost. The contractor will provide all receipts for materials and equipment rental. Horner & Shifrin will monitor the contractor during construction to evaluate the time actually spent installing the pipe.

The risk with the buried pipe that is driving the cost of the installation is the potential for groundwater. In an effort to eliminate the potential groundwater issue, Horner & Shirin generated an alternate proposal to hang the pipe on the interior side of the digester tank. This contractor would be able to utilize the pipe that has already been purchased, but would require additional fittings, pipe hangers, and supports. Horner & Shifrin generated an engineer's estimate for the alternative of \$41,000. This estimate is similar to the engineer's estimate for the buried pipe. The contractor provided an estimate of \$68,200 to install the pipe on the inside of the tank.

We recommend that the City proceed with the buried pipe option paying the contractor on a time and materials basis. H&S will have daily on-site inspection for the duration of the installation to verify the contractor's time



and equipment needed for installation. Construction on the plant site has been ongoing for over a year and we have significant documentation of conditions, construction methods utilized, and installation durations for other yard piping. We anticipate that the actual cost will be less than the estimate proposed by the contractor. If so, installing the pipe on the inside of the tank will not result in significant cost savings.

Horner & Shifrin considers this digester decant line to be a betterment and the City would have had a higher bid cost if the line was included. However, since the pipe was not included in the bid documents, H&S agrees to pay the cost increases for material and labor that have occurred since the project was bid in April 2021, which is consistent with court rulings for similar issues. The labor cost increase was estimated using published prevailing wage rates for St. Claire County, Illinois from 2/10/21 and 08/16/22. These show rates for laborers increased 7.1% and pipefitters 5.6%. The higher percentage increase of 7.1% was also applied to the Supervisor classification on the contractor's proposal. These percentages result in an increased cost for labor of \$1,445.42. Material pricing has experienced a significant cost increase. The contractor provided the cost of ductile iron pipe he used for the original bid of \$24.78 per foot and the price at the time of purchase of \$35.17 per foot, resulting in a 41.9% increase in material cost for ductile iron pipe. This percentage was applied to all materials resulting in an increase of \$6,851.32. Producer Price Index for Other Heavy Machinery Rental and Leasing shows an increase in equipment costs of 9.7%. This number was confirmed with United Rentals, who provided the quote for the contractor. The result is an increase of \$2,514.49. The difference in markup is \$1,621.69, resulting in a total increase in material and labor costs of \$12,432.92. A summary of the charges is shown on the attached breakdown provided by Litteken. Plocher will complete the site restoration for the installation, and they stated that no increase in their costs were applied to the additional work. They used the same rates used to generate the original bid. Horner & Shifrin's cost share will be a maximum amount of \$12, 432.92 that will be adjusted based on the time and materials for the actual charges.

BACKGROUND & STAFF COMMENTS:

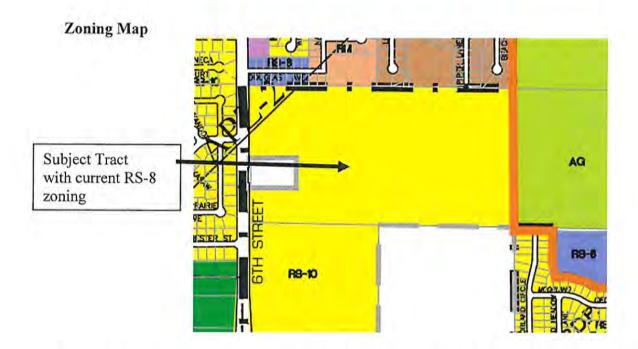
Property owner/developer: Fulford Homes

Proposal Summary

The developer has proposed a 202-lot preliminary plat for a single-family detached home neighborhood. The property is presently unaddressed but is located along the east side 6th Street just south of the intersection of Douglas Street and 6th Street (PID # 10300200007). The property was recently rezoned to "RS-8" Single-Family Residential District to accommodate approximately 90 lots that will be comprised of 8,000 to 10,000 square feet and approximately 115 lots will be comprised of more than 10,000 square feet.

Location and aerial photo of subject parcel





Property Size: A total of 77.98 acres comprised of 205 lots (along with 8 outlots

to accommodate detention areas, subdivision signage, etc.)

Topography: The subject property is generally flat with just a five to seven foot

elevation decline from the west to the southeast. The property is so flat that a variance for the vertical design of the roadways within the subdivision to allow for a minimum design slope of 0.5% instead of 1% as been requested. See Staff Discussion below for

additional information.

Vegetation: The property is used for agricultural crop purposes and therefore

lacks tree cover.

Utilities and Services: The City of Mascoutah will provide electric, sanitary sewer, water,

and public safety protection to the subject tract. Ameren Illinois

will provide natural gas services.

Access: The preliminary plat shows that three points of access will be

provided. The first is off 6th Street on the west, the second is via an extension of Heritage Road (Onyx Drive) from the southeast corner of the property, and the third is via a southward extension of

existing Piper Lane in the northeast corner of the property.

Right-of-way: The preliminary plat shows additional right-of-way being

dedicated along 6th Street. The westward extension of Heritage Drive (Onyx Drive) through this subdivision will serve as an eastwest collector street for the community. As Heritage Road (Onyx Drive) was originally dedicated with 60 feet of width east of the subject tract, this width will be continued through the subdivision to its connection with 6th Street. The developer has requested a variance from the standard collector street right-of-way width to

allow for this consistency.

Sidewalks:

Required sidewalks will be installed along all street frontages internal to the proposed subdivision. In addition, a multi-use path will be installed along 6th Street along the subject tract's west boundary. The width of this path, which leads south to existing City parkland, will accommodate pedestrians and cyclists and will serve as a good amenity for residents of the subdivision and the community as a whole.

Staff Discussion

Property layout in relation to school district property

Existing and future Mascoutah School District 19 facilities in proximity to the Prairie Lakes subdivision to the east and south will serve as an important amenity to future homeowners within the Prairie Lakes subdivision. Safe access for pedestrians and automobiles to school district property is an important consideration for the school district, the City, and the developer.

In light of this, school district officials have noted a concern about a change in the layout of the westward extension of Onyx Drive to 6th Street, which was originally anticipated to run along the south property line of the Prairie Lakes subdivision/ north property line of school district property. As shown on the preliminary plat, however, this roadway corridor has changed.

Staff's opinion is that the development of and access to school district property can still be accommodated in the southeast corner of the property next to Lots 58 and 67 (see picture below). In this area, a 4-way stop could be designed to allow for access to the school district property through a slight adjustment/straightening of the north/south roadway at the final plat stage of this portion of the Prairie Lakes property.

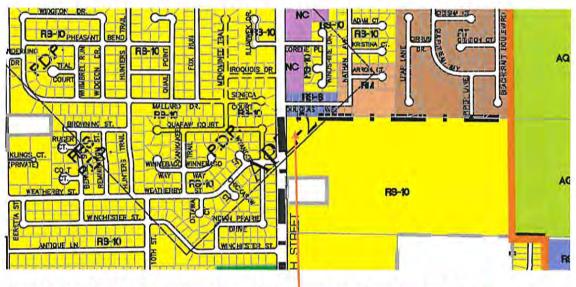


Area where a 4-way stop could be considered for access to Mascoutah School District property

Airport Accident Protection Zone

The subject tract includes several lots that are within the Airport Accident Protection Zone 2 (Airport APZ-2). The acreage of the lots within the APZ-2 is about 2.24 acres and include lots 198-205.

The purpose of the APZ-2 is to require that land and structures located within safety zones around the Scott AFB and MidAmerica St. Louis airfields be developed to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the public and to mitigate hazards of potential aircraft mishaps.

Specifically, Sec. 34-6-16, Use and Design Regulations in AO-2 states that the maximum density of single-family residential development within APZ-2 is one dwelling unit per acre. The developer has been alerted to this requirement.

On September 21, 2022, staff received the following comments/conditions from Scott AFB:

- 1. The proposed subdivision has approximately 2.24 acres located in the AO, Airport Overlay District, specifically the Accident Potential Zone (APZ-2). It is Scott AFB's determination that the portion of the Prairie Lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is not a compatible development within AO-1 and AO-2: APZ-2. IAW Section 34-6-11 (f) (2), the Air Force may recommend conditions of approval to mitigate any negative impacts of those actions within the AO-1 district. Scott AFB proposes the following conditions below on the proposed residential development:
 - a. Any dwelling constructed on Lot 189 shall be outside of APZ-2. The lot size is 0.35 acres and the portion of the lot within APZ-2 is rather small.

- b. Combine lots 198 through 205 (approx.. 2.2 acres) and split into two +/- 1.1 acre lots. This condition would eliminate 6 proposed lots from development. The information provided to Scott AFB does not give any indication as to the square footage or number of stories allowed for each lot. It is Scott AFB's assumption that at least a portion of a dwelling constructed on either lots 198 or 205 would fall within APZ-2.
- c. Request deed, or similar, restrictions on the combined +/- 1.1 acre lots so they cannot be subdivided into denser lots in the future or so that multiple dwellings cannot be built on a single lot.

If the above conditions are met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development. Scott AFB is not proposing any conditions on lot 206 in its current location and configuration, the portion of this lot within APZ-2 appears to be within required setbacks for the development.

The developer submitted a revised preliminary plat on September 22, 2022. This revised preliminary plat was sent to Scott AFB for further review. On October 12, 2022, staff received the following comments/conditions from Scott AFB:

- 1. It is Scott AFB's determination that the portion of the Prairie Lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is still not a compatible development within AO-1 and AO-2:APZ-2. IAW Section 34-6-11 (f) (2), the Air Force may recommend conditions of approval to mitigate any negative impacts of those actions within the AO-1 district. Scott AFB proposes the following conditions below on the proposed residential development:
 - a. If the detention areas cannot be constructed and maintained to drain within 72 hours and/or a wet bottom reservoir, a FAA Form 7460-1, Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration, shall be submitted to the FAA to determine if the proposed land-use changes increase the risk to airport safety by attracting hazardous wildlife across the approach and departure airspace of Scott AFB/MidAmerica St. Louis Airport. Additional conditions to obtain conditional approval of the development may or may not be required depending on the findings and possible mitigations stipulated by the FAA.
 - b. Request deed, or similar, restrictions on lots 190, 199, and 202 to ensure compliance with density requirements.

If the above conditions are met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development.

Variances

The developer has requested three subdivision variances in association with this preliminary plat.

<u>Variance 1 from Section Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23</u> which provides that the vertical design of the roadways within the subdivision to allow for a minimum design slope should be at least 1%. As the minimal topographic relief across the site does not provide enough elevation for street slopes to meet the minimum of 1%, the developer has requested a variance to allow for a half-percent (0.5%) slope for streets in this subdivision. Section 34-12-23 states that the minimum gradient may be reduced to 0.5 percent as determined by the development administrator.

<u>Variance 2 from Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23</u> provides that the minimum ROW width of "Street A" (westward extension of Heritage Road/Onyx Drive) should be 70 feet. The developer has requested a variance from this section to allow for the right-of-way of Street A to be 60 feet. At the time of construction, Heritage Road (Onyx Drive) was constructed at any identical right-of-way with of 60 feet. The developer would like to continue this standard as Street A connects to the west to 6th Street. Note that the pavement width will meet the minimum standard of 36 feet.

Variance 3 from Section 34-12-29 (b) This section states that, in meeting required greenspace standards, the subdivider/developer "shall not include nor credit water retention, water detention or other storm water management areas." For this subdivision however, the developer has indicated that these commons areas (Outlot Detention Areas B, C and D) will contain permanent water features and are potentially suitable to allow residents to use small watercrafts such as canoes, kayaks, paddleboats, and paddle boards and for fishing or remote control boats. Granting this variance, in combination with the multi-use path along 6th Street and a paved walking path around these detention areas, will enable the developer to significantly exceed the required greenspace provisions of 2 acres for the first 200 lots and 500 square feet for each lot over 500 square feet. Note that it will be the Homeowners Association's responsibility (initially overseen by the developer until the HOA is turned over to residents of the subdivision) to ensure that these three Outlot Detention Areas be properly maintained to be used for recreational purposes. It is anticipated that a separate Development Agreement between the developer and City Council will be agreed upon and signed to allow for this variance and ensure that the Outlot Detention Areas provide the recreational amenities this variance would allow for in the longterm.

<u>Note:</u> When the developer submitted the revised preliminary plat based on the first comments/conditions from Scott AFB, the developer requested removal of the paved trails that were to be installed around the detention areas to account for the then loss of 4 lots. It is staff's opinion that paved trails should still be required around the detention areas that are to be considered recreational in order to adequately delineate these water detention areas to be defined as recreational use. Without walking trails in these areas, it will be difficult for residents to know which portions are for recreational use and which portions are private property.

Planning Commission:

The Planning Commission held a public hearing to review this preliminary plat at their September 21, 2022 meeting. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the Preliminary Plat for Prairie Lakes Subdivision with approval of the variances, subject to the attached Findings of Approval, and contingent on the comments/conditions from Scott AFB regarding the acreage located within the APZ-2 being fully met and the Preliminary Plat being amended prior to City Council review and consideration.

Staff Recommendation

Per Sec. 34-12-3 (d) (1), no preliminary plat of a proposed subdivision shall be approved by the planning commission and city council unless the applicant proves by clear and convincing evidence that the proposed preliminary plat meets all of the requirements of this Code, all other applicable city ordinances, and all applicable state and federal laws and statutes. The preliminary plat as proposed does not meet all of the requirements of the code, specifically Sec. 34-6-16, Use Regulations in Safety Zones of the Airport Overlay District.

After consultation with the City Attorney, staff recommends denial of the preliminary plat as presented and recommends Council refer the preliminary plat back to the Planning Commission for further review and consideration of approval/denial to comply with the comments/conditions from Scott AFB regarding the acreage located within the APZ-2.

In addition, staff recommends the City Council provide comments on the following items which will provide guidance to the Planning Commission on the specific issues the Planning Commission will need to review further:

- 1. Comments/conditions from Scott AFB:
 - a. Sec. 34-6-16 (c)(ii), Single-family residential density shall be limited to one dwelling unit per acre within APZ-2; must be followed.
 - b. Requirements of detention areas located with APZ-2 are to be constructed and maintained to drain within 72 hours and/or a wet bottom reservoir must be followed.
 - c. Requirements must be met for any partial lot contained within the APZ-2 to ensure compliance with density requirements.
- 2. Approval/disapproval of the following variances for the proposed subdivision:
 - a. Variance from Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23 to allow for a half-percent (0.50%) slope for streets in this subdivision.
 - b. Variance from Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23 to allow for the right-of-way of Street A (the collector street) to be 60 feet. The pavement width will meet the minimum standard of 36 feet.
 - c. Variance from Section 34-12-29 (b) to allow the water retention areas located within Outlot Detention Areas B, C and D to be considered as greenspace. These common areas will contain permanent water features and are potentially suitable to allow residents to use small watercrafts such as canoes, kayaks, paddleboats, and paddle boards and for fishing or remote control boats. Note that it will be the Homeowners Association's responsibility (initially overseen by the developer until the HOA is turned over to residents of the subdivision) to ensure that these

three Outlot Detention Areas be properly maintained to be used for recreational purposes. Note: walking paths will be required around these water retention areas to be considered as greenspace.

SUGGESTED MOTION:

I move that the City Council deny the Preliminary Plat for Prairie Lakes Subdivision and refer the preliminary plat back to the Planning Commission for further review and consideration.

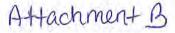

The minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Planning Commission of the City of Mascoutah.

PUBLIC HEARING - 7:00 PM

PC 22-04, Preliminary Plat, Fulford Homes

Scott Hanson, Senior Planner with CMT, presented the proposal summary of the preliminary plat submitted by Fulford Homes. The developer has proposed a 205-lot preliminary plat for a single-family detached home neighborhood. The property is presently unaddressed but is located along the east side 6th Street just south of the intersection of Douglas Street and 6th Street (PID # 10300200007). The property was recently rezoned to "RS-8" Single-Family Residential District to accommodate approximately 90 lots that will be comprised of 8,000 to 10,000 square feet. 115 lots will be comprised of more than 10,000 square feet. Hanson summarized the property size, topography, vegetation, utilities and services, proposed access points, right-of-way, and required sidewalk installations.

Hanson stated that the subject tract includes several lots that are within the Airport Accident Protection Zone 2 (Airport APZ-2). The acreage of the lots within the APZ-2 is about 2.24 acres and include lots 198-205. The purpose of the APZ-2 is to require that land and structures located within safety zones around the Scott AFB and MidAmerica St. Louis airfields be developed to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the public and to mitigate hazards of potential aircraft mishaps.

Assistant City Manager notified the commission that a response to the request for formal comments from Scott AFB today, September 21, 2022. The request for formal comments was sent to Scott AFB Community planner, Brian Collingham in August 2022. Scott AFB determined that the portion of the Prairie lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is not compatible development with AP-1 and AO-2: APZ-2.

Hanson presented the conditions proposed by SAFB. These conditions are as followed:

- 1. Any dwelling constructed on Lot 189 shall be outside of the APZ-2. The lot size is 0.35 acres and the portion of the lot within APZ-2 is rather small.
- 2. Combine lots 198 through 205 (approx. 2.2 acres) and split into two +/-1.1 acre lots. This condition would eliminate 6 proposed lots from development. The information provided to Scott AFB does not give any indication as to the square footage or number of stories allowed for each lot. It is Scott AFB's assumption that at least a portion of a dwelling constructed on either lot 198 or 205 would fall within APZ-2.
- Request deed, or similar, restrictions on the combined +/-1.1 acre lots so they cannot be subdivided into denser lots in the future or so that multiple dwellings cannot be built on a single lot.

The letter concluded that if the above conditions were met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development. Scott AFB is not proposing any conditions on lot 206 in its current location and configuration due to the fact that the portion of this lot within APZ-2 appears to be within the required setbacks for the development.

Hanson also presented the staff an overview of staff discussion on the property layout in relation to the school district property. He explained that the school districts concern regarding the change of layout of the westward extension of Onyx Drive to 6th Street. The original anticipated plan for the westward extension was to run along the south property line of the Prairie Lakes subdivision/north property line of the school district property. The staff's recommendation is a 4-way intersection in the southeast corner of the property next to lots 58 and 67. The 4-way stop could be designed to allow for access to the school district property through a slight a slight adjustment/straightening of the north/south roadway at the final plat stage of the southeast portion of the Prairie Lake property.

purposes. It is anticipated that a separate Development Agreement between the developer and City Council will be agreed upon and signed to allow for this variance and ensure that the Outlot Detention Areas provide the recreational amenities this variance would allow for in the long-term.

Assistant City Manager stated the staff recommends the approval of the proposed preliminary plat with approval of the variances, subject to the attached Findings of Approval, and the conditions from Scott AFB; approval of the three subdivision variances described with the contingency that a Development Agreement will be associated with this preliminary plat with regard to establishing the Homeowners Association's responsibility (initially overseen by the developer until the HOA is turned over to the residents of the subdivision) to ensure that the three Outlet Detention Areas will be properly maintained in order to be used for recreational purposed.

Marsha Maller of TWM, stated to the commission that they do not have an issue meeting the requirements presented. Their team will be looking at the other lots to alleviate losing 6 lots. They would like to amend the layout and ask the commission to move forward with approval so not to delay the project.

Assistant City Manager explained to the commission that they are able to approve the preliminary plat with these conditions requested.

Millikin asked if Scott AFB considerations are able to be appealed. Assistant City Manager stated that the applicant has the right to appeal to the Regional Advisory Board but the opinion is that the RAB will not grant the appeal and it will prolong the project's process.

Wobbe pointed out that the Indian Prairie subdivision have lots that are in violation of the Scott AFB terms. Assistant City Manager explained that the current Scott AFB team is quite strict with building code, as they should for the safety of the public. Assistant City Manager also pointed out that many of those lots are much larger and the other developments were already in place before the airport was built.

Millikin asked about the school district's opinion of the project and the road access opinion. Assistant City Manager explained the initial road access plans and reviewed the future option/needs.

Wobbe asked if the city knows what the school district's plans were for the abutting property. Assistant City Manager stated that they don't know the exact plans for the school district's property but that the project is probably 5-10 years out.

Marsha Maller explained that there is currently only half of a road way on Heritage Way (Onyx Drive). Assistant City Manager explained the 70-foot code requirement for collector roads. She stated that when Brightly designed/acquired 60-foot road way which has now resulted in the standard for this roadway. Maller explained that the grass portion will be affected not the actual roadway.

Connor asked about the parking allotment. Maller explained that the city has the ability to allow parking on one side of the road or even not at all.

Maller gave a detailed explanation about where the drainage will runoff as well as the drainage plan. The design standards will be reviewed by a third-party engineering firm as well as the public works staff.

Thompson asked about the vegetation/buffer around the Burkhardt property. Maller stated that there are no pipes discharging into the Burkhardt property. She stated that there will be strategic low points and that the engineered plans will be presented in the future. Assistant City Manager stated that the existing vegetation around that property is on the Burkhardt property.

Matt Lanter explained the variations of homes and the options that will be available. The base homes are generally 2,500 square feet in size. He stated that the Fulford Home website showcased the base home options.

Hanson requested that Fulford Homes put a restriction for modular home placement on lots. Lanter stated that there is a boiler point in their HOA agreement that there will never be any prefabricated homes.

Wobbe asked for explanation on variance slope. Maller explained the engineer plans for the slopes and gave examples of other subdivisions in the area that have the same kind of engineered plans.

Thompson asked about the retention ponds and the erosion possibilities. Millikin asked about how the HOA is funded until the project is completed. Lanter explained that the developer funds the first few years until the HOA is operational and then it is then turned over to a management group. Maller explained as each property is sold, the funds are deposited into the HOA fund.

Chairman Zacharski asked about the greenspace. Maller stated that there will be greenspace. The plans include walking areas surrounding each small lake. The commission was reminded that there will be a final plat approval in the future that will address the roadway/entrance.

Jung stated that he believes that the preliminary plan is not going to remain close to this plan based on the comments from Scott AFB due to the loss of lots. Maller stated that they will have to make some changes to gain some of the lots but the roadway will remain the same. Lanter pointed out that the smaller lots are not less desirable and Fulford Homes will be building the homes. He also stated that Fulford Homes subdivisions do not have overgrown detention ponds.

There was no further discussion.

Millikin moved, seconded by Wobbe, that the Planning Commission recommend approval to the City Council of the Preliminary Plat for Prairie Lakes Subdivision with approval of the variances, subject to the attached Findings of Approval, and contingent on the comments/conditions from Scott AFB regarding the acreage located within the APZ-2 being fully met and the Preliminary Plat being amended prior to City Council review and consideration.

FINDINGS FOR APPROVAL (Section 34-12-3(d) Standards for approval of preliminary plats)

FINDINGS: The Mascoutah Planning Commission, pursuant to the preliminary plat review process, and after considering the effect of the request to approve the preliminary plat on the health, safety, morals and general welfare of the residents in the City, specifically finds:

- 1. The proposed preliminary plat meets all the requirements of the Unified Land Development Code and other applicable City ordinances, and state and federal laws and statutes.
- 2. Adequate provisions have been made for a sufficient water supply system and public sewage system.
- 3. The proposed subdivision will not result in the scattered subdivision of land that leaves undeveloped parcels of land lacking infrastructure between developed parcels.
- 4. The subdivider has taken every effort to mitigate the impact of the proposed subdivision on public health, safety, and welfare.
- 5. The proposed subdivision has approximately 2.24 acres located in the AO, Airport Overlay District, specifically the Accident Potential Zone (APZ-2). It is Scott AFB's determination that the portion of the Prairie Lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is not a compatible development within AO-1 and AO-2: APZ-2. IAW Section 34-6-11 (f) (2), the Air Force may recommend conditions of approval to mitigate any negative impacts of those actions within the AO-1 district. Scott AFB proposes the following conditions below on the proposed residential development:
 - a. Any dwelling constructed on Lot 189 shall be outside of APZ-2. The lot size is 0.35 acres and the portion of the lot within APZ-2 is rather small.
 - b. Combine lots 198 through 205 (approx.. 2.2 acres) and split into two +/- 1.1 acre lots. This condition would eliminate 6 proposed lots from development. The information provided to Scott AFB does not give any indication as to the square footage or number of stories allowed for each lot. It is Scott AFB's assumption that at least a portion of a dwelling constructed on either lots 198 or 205 would fall within APZ-2.
 - c. Request deed, or similar, restrictions on the combined +/- 1.1 acre lots so they cannot be subdivided into denser lots in the future or so that multiple dwellings cannot be built on a single lot.

If the above conditions are met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development. Scott AFB is not proposing any conditions on lot 206 in its current location and configuration, the portion of this lot within APZ-2 appears to be within required setbacks for the development.

- 6. The following variances are approved for the proposed subdivision:
 - a. Variance from Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23 to allow for a half-percent (0.50%) slope for streets in this subdivision.

- b. Variance from Table 12-2 (Street Design Specifications) in Section 34-12-23 to allow for the right-of-way of Street A (the collector street) to be 60 feet. The pavement width will meet the minimum standard of 36 feet.
- c. Variance from Section 34-12-29 (b) to allow the water retention areas located within Outlot Detention Areas B, C and D to be considered as greenspace. These common areas will contain permanent water features and are potentially suitable to allow residents to use small watercrafts such as canoes, kayaks, paddleboats, and paddle boards and for fishing or remote control boats. Note that it will be the Homeowners Association's responsibility (initially overseen by the developer until the HOA is turned over to residents of the subdivision) to ensure that these three Outlot Detention Areas be properly maintained to be used for recreational purposes.

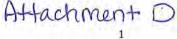
Hello Kari,

Thank for the opportunity to review this proposed development within the City of Mascoutah. The parcel in question, ID #10-30.0-200-0007, is partially located within Scott AFB's Accident Potential Zone #2 (APZ-2) and was recently rezoned from RS-10, Single Family Residential - Suburban, to RS-8, Single Family Residential - Urban, by the City of Mascoutah. The parcel is located within the Airport Overlay District, Sub Area 1 (AO-1), Primary Planning Influence Area, and Sub Area 2 (AO-2), Safety Zone Area. The purpose of the safety zones is to require that land and structures located within safety zones around the Scott AFB and MidAmerica St. Louis airfields are developed to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the public and to mitigate hazards of potential aircraft mishaps.

The proposed 206 lot single-family Prairie Lakes residential development is located on 78 acres that is partially located in APZ-2 as shown on the attached georeferenced map by Scott AFB. IAW the Unified Land Development Code of the City of Mascoutah, Section 34-6-16 (c) (ii), Single-family residential density shall be limited to one dwelling unit per acre within APZ-2, provided that any smaller subdivided lot existing as of the date of this article shall not be prohibited from use for single-family due solely to failure to comply with this supplemental density limitation (the second part only applies to already platted subdivisions). All or part of 10 of the 206 lots are located within our APZ-2 (approx. 2.24 acres or 2.9% of the total area of the development). The lots in question (189, 198-206) range from 0.2 (8,750 SF) to 0.48 (21,006 SF) acres in size (see page 7 of plat attachment). IAW Section 34-6-5 (c) of the Unified Land Development Code, Split parcels, for purposes of regulation of parcels that appear split by the district boundary lines, only that portion of a parcel that falls within the district shall be subject to the provisions and standards of this division. Also, IAW Section 34-6-6. Subareas; overlap, properties or portions of properties located within multiple subareas shall comply with the standards established for each of those subareas in which the property is located.

It is Scott AFB's determination that the portion of the Prairie Lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is not a compatible development within AO-1 and AO-2:APZ-2. IAW Section 34-6-11 (f) (2), the Air Force may recommend conditions of approval to mitigate any negative impacts of those actions within the AO-1 district. Scott AFB proposes the following conditions below on the proposed residential development:

- 1) Any dwelling constructed on Lot 189 shall be outside of APZ-2. The lot size is 0.35 acres and the portion of the lot within APZ-2 is rather small.
- 2) Combine lots 198 through 205 (approx.. 2.2 acres) and split into two +/- 1.1 acre lots. This condition would eliminate 6 proposed lots from development. The information provided to Scott AFB does not give any indication as to the square footage or number of stories allowed for each lot. It is Scott AFB's assumption that at least a portion of a dwelling constructed on either lots 198 or 205 would fall within APZ-2.



3) Request deed, or similar, restrictions on the combined +/- 1.1 acre lots so they cannot be subdivided into denser lots in the future or so that multiple dwellings cannot be built on a single lot.

If the above conditions are met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development. Scott AFB is not proposing any conditions on lot 206 in its current location and configuration, the portion of this lot within APZ-2 appears to be within required setbacks for the development. 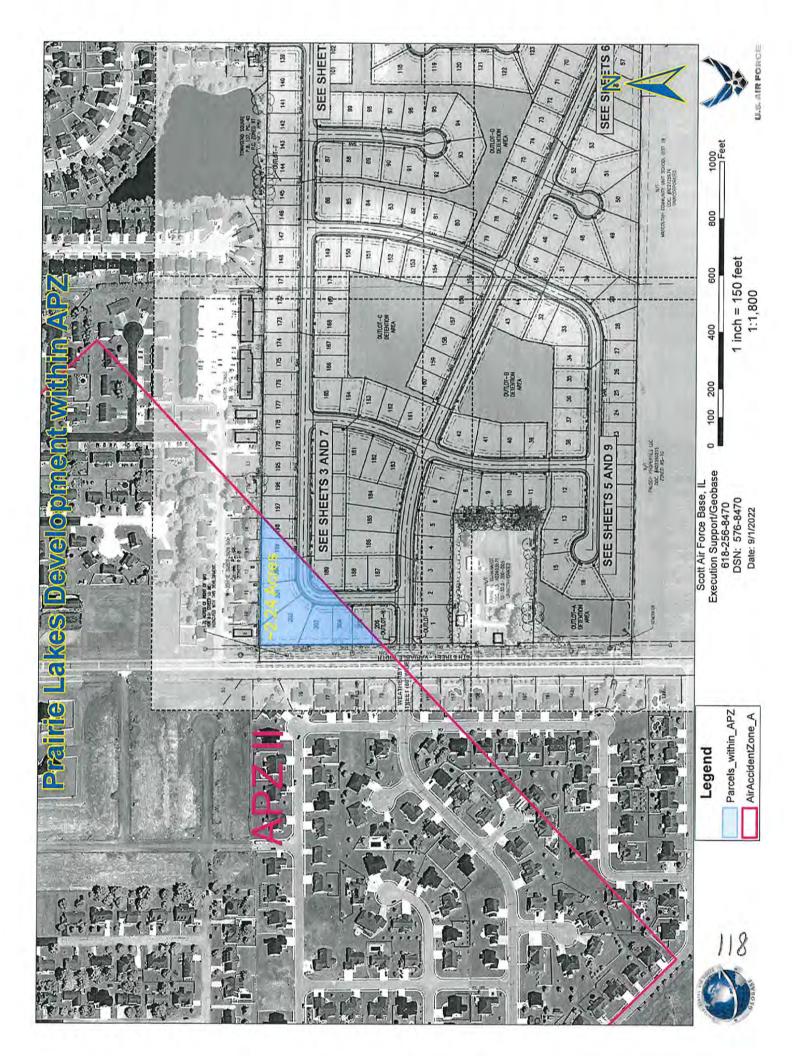

Thank you for providing the revised preliminary plat. The solution provided by the developer is certainly creative and was not what we were expecting to receive in response to our conditions on the development. The creation of a detention basin within APZ-2 can provide both benefits and potential concerns depending on how the basin is constructed, managed, and used. There is no mention of detention basins within any of the Airport Overlay districts and from reviewing the Unified Land Development Code of the City of Mascoutah, your code does not specifically identify construction and maintenance requirements, nor does it seem to define a specific drainage time for drainage basins. Within Section 34-12-24, Drainage and storm sewers, the word "detention" is referenced in multiple places within the code (see highlighted references within the attached word document) and the code allows for both wet or dry bottom reservoirs.

Additionally, the City of Mascoutah has referred to these detention areas as water amenities. IAW Section 34-6-8, General Use Restrictions, Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Unified Land Development Code, no use whether permitted in the underlying zoning district, or by planned use, special use permit, or otherwise, may be made of land or water within the airport overlay (AO) district so as to: (i) Create a bird or wildlife strike hazard that in any way endangers or interferes with the landing, takeoff, or maneuvering of aircraft using or intending to use the airport. Next, I refer you to FAA Advisory Circular 150/5200-33C, Hazardous Wildlife Attractants on or near Airports, particularly to Sections 1.4, 2.3.2, and Chapter 4. Within Section 1.4, the FAA recommends a distance of 5 miles between the closest point of the airport's aircraft operations area and the hazardous wildlife attractant with special attention given to wildlife movement into or across the approach and departure airspace. Section 2.3.2 references recommendations for New Stormwater Management Facilities. Scott AFB generally follows the FAA recommendation that stormwater detention ponds should be designed, engineered, constructed, and maintained for a maximum 48-hour detention period and remain dry between storms. However, our large detention basin by the MetroLink station is designed to drain within 72 hours. At this time, Scott AFB believes Chapter 4 would only be applicable if these detention areas will be holding water longer than 72 hours. Chapter 4 refers to the FAA Notification and review of proposed land-use changes in the vicinity of public use airports. Specifically, Sections 4.3.1 and 4.3.2 encourages operators of public-use airports who become aware of proposed land use practice changes to notify the FAA and allows either the airport operator, project proponent, or landuse operator to submit FAA Form 7460-1, Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration to notify the appropriate FAA Regional Office to review the proposed development.

The revised figure provided by the developer appears to indicate that dwellings could be built within lots 190, 199, and 202 outside of Accident Potential Zone 2 (APZ-2). It was not Scott AFB's intention/desire to satisfy the density requirements within APZ-2 by increasing the density of dwellings immediately outside of APZ-2. An aircraft in need of an emergency landing is not necessarily going to land exactly within and stay within the APZ-2 box. Also, while the

developer has shown that a theoretical dwelling could be built outside of APZ-2 neither the developer nor the City of Mascoutah has provided any assurances that an actual dwelling will be built outside of APZ-2 or that a dwelling initially built outside of APZ-2 will not have an addition built in the future that would expand its footprint within APZ-2. The theoretical dwelling shown in Lot 199 is wedged tightly in the southeast corner of the lot, Scott AFB is not entirely convinced that an actually dwelling can be built and remain outside of APZ-2 within the proposed lot.

It is Scott AFB's determination that the portion of the Prairie Lakes residential development within APZ-2 as proposed is still not a compatible development within AO-1 and AO-2:APZ-2. IAW Section 34-6-11 (f) (2), the Air Force may recommend conditions of approval to mitigate any negative impacts of those actions within the AO-1 district. Scott AFB proposes the following conditions below on the proposed residential development:

- 1. If the detention areas cannot be constructed and maintained to drain within 72 hours and/or a wet bottom reservoir, a FAA Form 7460-1, Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration, shall be submitted to the FAA to determine if the proposed land-use changes increase the risk to airport safety by attracting hazardous wildlife across the approach and departure airspace of Scott AFB/MidAmerica St. Louis Airport. Additional conditions to obtain conditional approval of the development may or may not be required depending on the findings and possible mitigations stipulated by the FAA.
- 2. Request deed, or similar, restrictions on lots 190, 199, and 202 to ensure compliance with density requirements.

If the above conditions are met, the proposed Prairie Lakes residential development would be considered a compatible development. I would recommend having a RAB for this development, the decisions made regarding this development could affect similar types of the development in other communities. It might be beneficial to all to have a larger discussion particularly regarding drainage basins so that so that the same requirements/expectations are applied as equally as possible to each community wishing to develop within one of the Airport Overlay Districts. If you have any questions, please let me know.

Thanks for the email.

Kari and I spoke earlier today about the changes you provided on the preliminary plat last week to meet the recommendations of SAFB. Kari forwarded the revision you provided to the SAFB representative to see if we could get a response from them ASAP. In the meantime, would you mind walking us through your calculations so we can explain this correctly to City Council?

Specifically, City staff have the following concerns / questions / clarification requests:

- 1) Several lots were combined, resulting in Outlot G Detention Area. What remains are Lots 200 and 201 available for single family development. Assuming 1 dwelling unit per acre is allowed within APZ-2, the future homes on Lots 201 and 200 will account for both dwellings within the 2.2 acre APZ-2 triangle. No others will be within (or partially within) the APZ-2 zone
- 2) Assuming #1 is correct and Lots 200 and 201 will be the locations where dwelling units will be located within the APZ-2 zone, we would like to make sure for the following
 - a. For Lot 199, please provide a typical that shows that the building foundation is 100% outside of the APZ-2 zone. We want to see that achieving this is possible in your response so we can show this to City Council.
 - b. For Lot 190, would similarly request a "typical" of how Lot 190 might develop with regard to the building footprint. We want to be able to show that the future dwelling unit on this lot will be 100% clear of the APZ-2 boundary.
 - c. For Lot 202, we would similarly request a "typical" that shows the building foundation for the dwelling unit on this lot will be 100% clear of the APZ-2 boundary.

Of the 3 lots listed above, Lot 202 is probably the most difficult to show the dwelling unit will be fully outside the APZ-2 zone. If it cannot be confirmed that all 3 building foundations are outside of the APZ-2 zone, however, it is likely that the changes you recently made to the preliminary plat drawing will not meet the requirements of the SAFB.

Mascoutah staff is open to further explanation as to how you arrived at the current configuration. But we'd request that you'd walk us through how you concluded the changes meet SAFB recommendations so we can assure the City Council if they have similar concerns.

- 3) The arrow pointing to Outlot H is covered by the APZ-2 boundary. Please adjust so the arrow is clearly legible.
- 4) Finally, staff is disappointed that the paved sidewalks around Outlots B, C and D are not able to be accommodated. To make the areas around these ponds accessible, to reduce confusion as to whether residents of the subdivision are on private or "common area" property, and to ensure the long-term functionality of these recreational areas, staff would request that the decision be reconsidered as paved walking paths are viewed as critical to the future enjoyment of the water amenities.
